

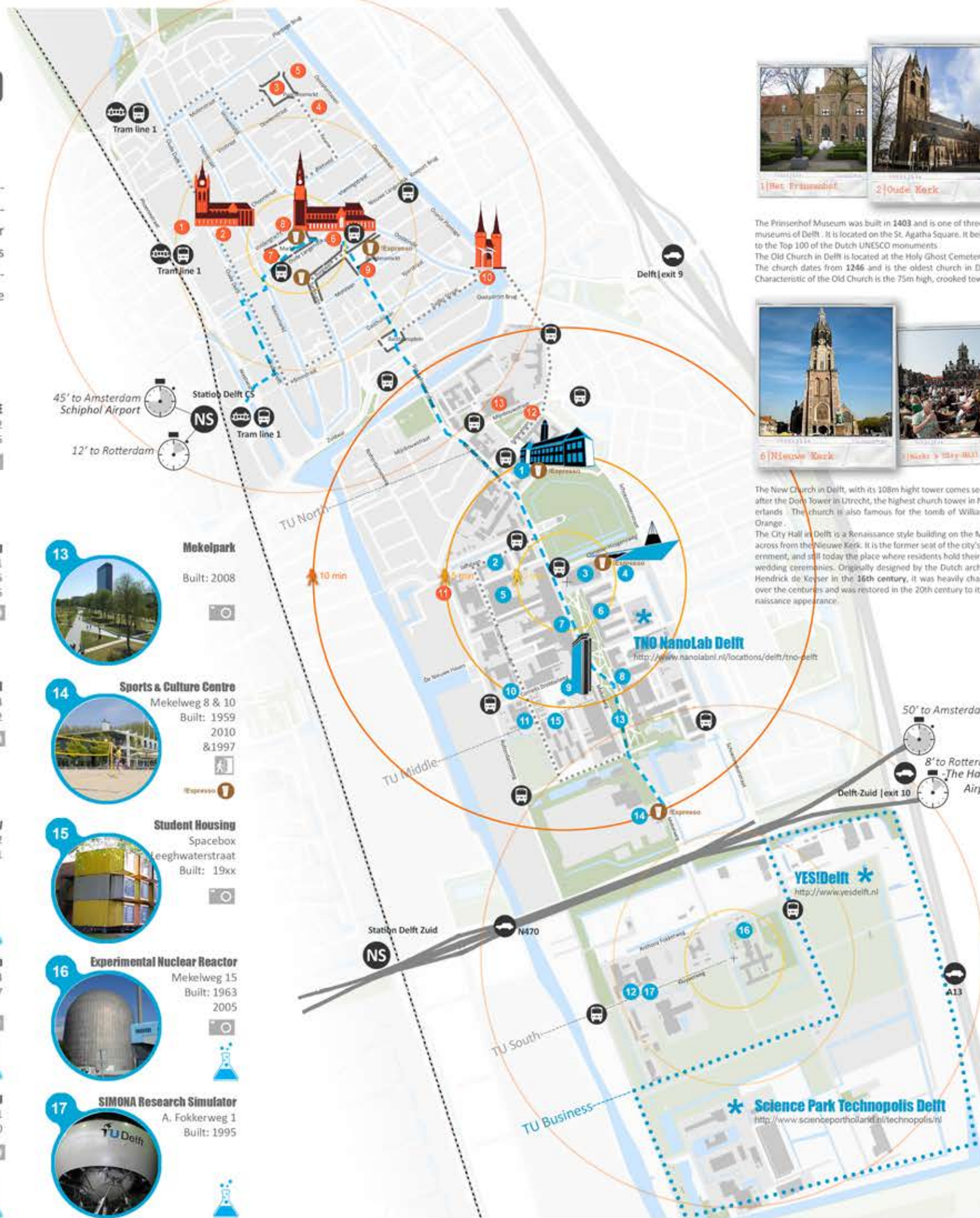


# TU Delft univercity map

The Prinsenhof Museum was built in 1403 and is one of three city museums of Delft. It is located on the St. Agatha Square. It belongs to the Top 100 of the Dutch UNESCO monuments. The Old Church in Delft is located at the Holy Ghost Cemetery 25. The church dates from 1246 and is the oldest church in Delft. Characteristic of the Old Church is the 75m high, crooked tower.

The New Church in Delft, with its 108m high tower comes second after the Dom Tower in Utrecht, the highest church tower in Netherlands. The church is also famous for the tomb of William of Orange. The City Hall in Delft is a Renaissance style building on the Markt across from the Nieuwe Kerk. It is the former seat of the city's government, and still today the place where residents hold their civic wedding ceremonies. Originally designed by the Dutch architect Hendrick de Keyser in the 16th century, it was heavily changed over the centuries and was restored in the 20th century to its Renaissance appearance.
